Please join us to celebrate the devoted contributions of Margaret Huntley to the Mental Health Community over many decades as a Child and Adult Psychiatrist and Adult Psychoanalyst.

One of Dr. Huntley’s greatest achievements we honour with the Symposium was her untiring decade of devotion as a Director of the Toronto Child Psychotherapy Program (TCPP) which she helped to become a four year intensive psychoanalytic psychotherapy program, two didactic evenings a week, where children were seen three to four times weekly and candidates were in their own analysis with members of the IPA.

When Dr. Huntley took over the helm of this program, she introduced a democratic organizational structure and established standards of training that became recognized by the IPA and the Committee of Child & Adolescent Psychoanalysis of the IPA.

Presenters & Discussants

To honour Dr. Huntley in this Symposium we have two clinical presentations by graduates of the program: **Child** - Dannette Graham, past President of the CAPCT **Adolescent** - Dagnija Tenne current president of the CAPCT.

Susan Yabsley, a graduate in Child Analysis of the Anna Freud Centre, U.K.. and head of the Infancy and Psychology Training Programs at the Hincks Dellcrest Mental Health Centre will discuss the child presentation. David Dorenbaum, M.D. Child/Adolescent/Adult Psychiatrist and Adult Psychoanalyst, Faculty TIP and OCAD-U will discuss the adolescent presentation.

The Symposium welcomes dialogue with all of the presenters.

Learning Objectives:

1. Become familiar with the contemporary understanding of symptoms and syndromes in children and adolescents.
2. Relate these symptoms and syndromes, both treated and not treated to their later developments in adults who present for psychotherapy treatments.

3. Identify how aspects of the early parts of the histories of adult patients and clients may have appeared and evolved in childhood and adolescence.
4. Understand the active and interactive roles of parents and other adults and children in influencing the psychopathology of children and adolescents who one day appears for treatment as adults.

Following the Symposium we will have an opportunity to express good wishes to Dr. Huntley during the Wine and Cheese reception. Entertainment will be provided by a High School student and Guitarist “Alejandro” who will play for us his award winning compositions.
