ABSTRACT

Adoptive children have always had to construct a narrative about themselves, their families and their identity. Now, with children coming into the world through assisted reproductive technology, surrogacy or other alternative means, these narratives are more complex. We will review the issues these children face as they come to understand their origins, the various persons who may be on their birth certificate and who may have been involved in their "formation" as a person.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- 1. To discuss the contradictions in the new fertility from a child's point of view to help the child navigate them.
- 2. This workshop will provide practitioners with an alternative to WTF when they hear a child dealing with: Who's your daddy? Who's your mummy? Why do you have two mummies? What do you mean your daddy is now your mummy? Where is your real mummy? Are you going to search for your sperm or egg donor? Do you have brothers or sisters with other families? Why are there 4 people on your birth certificate? Why are you behaving like this when we spent so many years and thousands of dollars to get you? Did your mom get to choose from albums of photos of donors was he hot?
