BORDERLINE MOMENTS IN THERAPY

Abstract

Dr. Mark Voysey a TCPP graduate and child and adolescent psychiatrist published in this area, will lead a discussion on the vicissitudes of the three main borderline clinical phenomena and associated features of grandiosity, narcissism (pathological) and therapeutic intent. Participants are encouraged to bring (anonymous) "moments" in therapy that fit the category of "borderline phenomena" (i.e. "difficult," "disturbing," or "impossible" cases) for the mediated collegial discussion. Although participants should bring their theoretical understanding of these phenomena the discussion will focus on the actual phenomena, the responses of the therapist and will provide tips and tools for increased potency when dealing with such challenging experiences.

- 1. Be able to label, describe and identify the three common major clinical borderline phenomena.
- 2. To be able to label, describe identify at least one major narcissistic phenomenon.
- 3. To appreciate the clinician's own engagement in such phenomena and to explore options to utilize this awareness for positive therapeutic intent.
