A case of a child witness of domestic violence, identification with the aggressor, and projection of the aggression onto the mother.

ABSTRACT

The focus of the presentation is a long-term psychodynamic case with a latency-age boy, Jay, affected by exposure to domestic violence and the stressful separation/divorce of his parents. I will describe how Jay's defenses have shown themselves in his relationship with his mother, from identification with the aggressor-father to projection of the aggression onto the mother and how these defenses have played out in both the transference and countertransference. I will describe how, over time, Jay's expression of aggression transformed from catharsis to sublimation, how, by means of sensory-based media such as clay, Jay was able to reenact his trauma, express his need for a container, walls, protective fortifications, and safety. The therapeutic relationship, my validation of his needs, and our therapeutic conversation about his thematic work, seems to have been an important factor of change. In addition to individual sessions, mother-child sessions helped the participants become more aware of each other's feelings and helped the mother to develop greater reflecting capacity.
