ABSTRACT

In this workshop we will present the Infant – Parent Psychotherapy model (IPP), developed by the authors – a relationship based approach using psychoanalytic principles. IPP is an infant led relationship intervention that requires an active participation by the clinician, both with the infant and the parent. The clinician engages with the infant and the parent, and tries to help each understand the needs and communication of the other. The clinicians will describe and show video segments of a case to attempt to locate the determining dynamics that lead to a positive outcome.

- 1. To acquaint participants with the principles of IPP model;
- 2. To follow a case from psychic equivalence to pretend mode (Fonagy, Target et al);
- 3. To understand how the concept of the third is used in infant-parent therapy
